The Power of Playdough

Playdough also encourages the children's language, literacy, science, and math skills—all at the same time!

Here is the simple recipe that you can make at home with your child.

5 cups flour
1 cup salt
2 tbsp Alum/cream of tartar
4 tbsp cooking oil
4 cups water (hot)
Food coloring
Boil water, add oil and coloring. Mix all dry ingredients and knead until smooth.

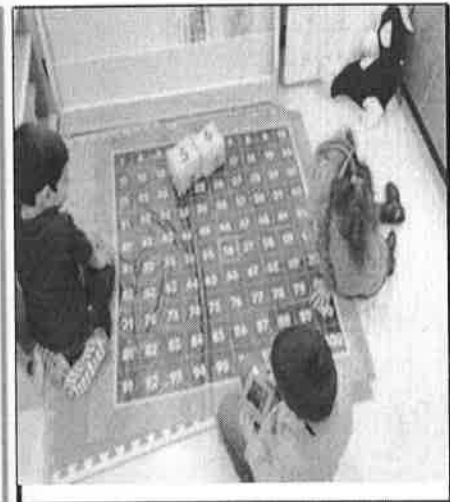
